Overview of Revisions to the Enforcement Regulations under the Food Sanitation Law

I. Objective for revisions

A certain post harvest fungicide will be approved. After that, such fungicide-treated fruits will be allowed for sale.

Current regulation stipulates that the fruits treated with post harvest fungicide should be sold with lists as “fungicide” and its chemical names.

II. Major points of revisions

Apple, apricot, banana, cherry, citrus fruits, Japanese plum, kiwifruits, loquat, nectarine, peach, pear, pomegranate, and quince will be included to the list of items required to label mandatorily in accordance with the Enforcement Regulations under the Food Sanitation Law.

III. Relevant document

Relevant document is the Enforcement Regulations under the Food Sanitation Law (Ministerial Ordinance No.23 of 1948)
