Revocation of designation of Colistin sulfate and Virginiamycin as feed additives.

- 1. Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries (MAFF) will revoke designation of Colistin sulfate and Virginiamycin since Food Safety Commission of Japan concluded the Antimicrobial resistance(AMR) risks of these two feed additives were medium in its risk assessment titled "effect of food on human health regarding antimicrobial-resistant bacteria selected by antimicrobial use in food producing animals".
- 2. Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries (MAFF) will revoke standards and specifications for Colistin sulfate and Virginiamycin stipulated in the ministerial ordinance.
