SUBJECT: GUIDELINES ON THE REGISTRATION OF AGRICULTURAL AND FISHERIES

MACHINERY MANUFACTURERS, FABRICATORS, ASSEMBLERS, DISTRIBUTORS,

DEALERS, IMPORTERS AND EXPORTERS AND THEIR PRODUCTS

Pursuant to Sections 20 and 24 of Republic Act No. 10601, otherwise known as the Agricultural and Fisheries Mechanization Law and its Implementing Rules and Regulations, this Guidelines on the registration of agricultural and fisheries machinery manufacturers, fabricators, assemblers, distributors, dealers, importers and exporters and their products is hereby promulgated and issued by the Bureau of Agricultural and Fisheries Engineering (BAFE) to implement the provisions of the said Act, for the guidance and information of all concerned.

ARTICLE I GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 1. Objective

This Circular sets the guidelines and procedures of the BAFE on the Registration of Agricultural and Fisheries Machinery Manufacturers, Fabricators, Assemblers, Distributors, Dealers, Importers and Exporters (MFADDIE) and their products. It aims to regulate the businesses engaged in the manufacture, fabrication, assembly, distribution, importation and exportation of agricultural and fisheries machinery. Specifically, it aims to meet the following:

- a. Prevent the proliferation of MFADDIE committing any misconduct in selling agricultural and fisheries machinery;
- b. Establish a national registry of agricultural and fisheries MFADDIE and machinery supplied in the market;
- c. Secure fair trade practices among MFADDIE and end-users;
- d. Provide opportunities for business growth; and
- e. Safeguard the interest of the consumers.

SECTION 2. Scope

This Guidelines shall cover the registration of agricultural and fisheries machinery MFADDIE and their products. It shall include the issuance of permit to operate (PTO) to MFADDIE and certificate of product registration (CPR).

SECTION 3. Definition of Terms

For the purpose of this Circular, the following definitions are hereby adopted:

- a. Agricultural and Fisheries Machinery refers to machinery and equipment for the production, post-production, harvesting, processing, storage, manufacture, preserving, transporting and distribution of agricultural and fisheries products and by-products. It includes, but not limited to, tractors and their attachments, power tillers, seeders, transplanters, windmills, harvesting machines, crop protection and maintenance equipment, irrigation equipment and accessories, greenhouses and other thermal conditioning equipment, livestock equipment, fishery equipment, slaughtering equipment, meat/fishery and crop processing equipment, postharvest machines such as milling machines, dryers, threshers and fiber extraction machines (Source: D.C. 05, Series of 2017)
- b. **Applicant** refers to natural or juridical person engaged in the business of manufacturing, fabrication, assembly, distribution, dealing, importation and exportation of agricultural and fisheries machinery
- c. **Assembler** refers to any entity involved in the assembly using individual parts and components for the production of agricultural and fisheries machinery to be offered in the market

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- d. **Authorized Representative (AR)** refers to the person/s duly authorized by the applicant who is an organic personnel of the company who will be the primary point of contact for all matters relating to the application for the issuance of Permit to Operate and Certificate of Product Registration
- **Certificate of Product Registration** refers to the certificate issued for the products reported to the BAFE
- Compliance Certificate certificate issued by BAFE which guarantees that the agricultural and fisheries machinery conforms with PNS/PAES
- **Dealer** refers to an authorized representative of distributors and/or manufacturers to supply, trade, sell and service agricultural and fisheries machinery to end-users (PNS/PAES 192:2016)
- Distributor refers to any trading entity authorized by foreign or local suppliers and/or manufacturers to distribute agricultural and fisheries machinery to dealers (PNS/PAES 192:2016)
- Establishment refers to an entity, partnership, company, corporation or cooperative engaged in the business of manufacturing, fabrication, assembly, distribution, dealing, importation and exportation of agricultural and fisheries machinery
- **Holder** refers to any entity that is duly authorized by BAFE to manufacture, fabricate, assemble. distribute, deal, import and export agricultural and fisheries machinery
- Importer/Exporter refers to any trading entity involved in the business of importing or exporting of agricultural and fisheries machinery from/to any point outside the Philippines either for its own use or for trading purposes
- **Inspection** refers to all field activities being undertaken by the BAFE for purposes of evaluating and checking the facilities of an establishment
- m. Manufacturer/Fabricator refers to any manufacturing entity involved in the production of agricultural and fisheries machinery
- n. **Permit to Operate** refers to the privilege granted to any MFADDIE that have passed the review, inspection and evaluation conducted by BAFE and is allowed to engage in a particular line of activity which include manufacturing, fabrication, assembly, distribution, dealing, importation and exportation of agricultural and fisheries machinery
- Product agricultural and fisheries machinery offered by individual agricultural and fisheries machinery MFADDIE;
- Regional Agricultural Engineering Division (RAED) refers to the division of the Department of Agriculture – Regional Field Office authorized to assist the Department of Agriculture – Bureau of Agricultural and Fisheries Engineering (DA - BAFE) in the enforcement / implementation of the provisions of this Circular.
- **Registration** refers to all the processes involved in the review, evaluation, inspection, validation and approval of documents and facilities for the purpose of legalizing the business operations to manufacture, fabricate, assemble, distribute, deal, import and export of agricultural and fisheries machinery
- Standards Regulation and Enforcement Division (SRED) refers to the division authorized by the DA – BAFE Engineering to enforce / implement the provisions of this Circular.

ARTICLE II **DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

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SECTION 4. Duties and Responsibilities of the Bureau of Agricultural and Fisheries Engineering and DA - Regional Agricultural Engineering Division

SECTION 4.1 The BAFE shall have the following functions:

- Review and evaluate all applications for the registration and issuance of Permit to Operate to agricultural and fisheries machinery manufacturers, fabricators, assemblers, distributors, dealers, importers and exporters (MFADDIE) and Certificate of Product Registration for their products
- Conduct on-site inspection and validation of all applications prior to the issuance of PTO and CPR;
- Issue PTO and CPR to applicants who comply with all the requirements for registration;
- Conduct surveillance monitoring to establishments of PTO holders;
- Maintain a registry of all MFADDIE and PTO holders and their products; and
- Perform other duties and functions relevant to the registration and issuance of PTO to MFADDIE of agricultural and fisheries machinery.

SECTION 4.2 The DA-RAED Standards Regulations and Enforcement Section (SRES) shall have the following functions:

- Initially evaluate applications for renewal of PTO to MFADDIE of agricultural and fisheries machinery within their respective regions before forwarding the applications to BAFE;
- Assist the BAFE in the conduct of site inspection and validation;
- Monitor the performance of all PTO holders within their respective regions;
- Perform other duties and functions relevant to the issuance of PTO to MFADDIE of agricultural and fisheries machinery.

ARTICLE III REQUIREMENTS FOR REGISTRATION

All manufacturers, fabricators, assemblers, distributors, dealers, importers and exporters of agricultural and fisheries machinery shall register with the BAFE and apply for the issuance of Permit to Operate (PTO) and Certificate of Product Registration (CPR).

The application for PTO is classification- and location-specific. Establishments which are engaged in different lines of activity or maintain other branches in other locations shall be required to register its branches separately and pay the corresponding fees.

- Official receipt of payment;
- Additional Requirements pursuant to PD 1586 also known as The Philippine EIS System and its Implementing Rules and Regulations, DENR AO No. 30 Series of 2003, Memorandum Circular 2014-005, and Memorandum Circular 2015-0003
 - For establishments (manufacturer) under Category A and B: Photocopy of Environmental Compliance Certificate (ECC);
 - ii. For establishments under Category D: Photocopy of Certificate on Non Coverage (CNC).

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SECTION 12 On-Site Inspection and Evaluation

The on-site inspection and evaluation shall be conducted by BAFE in the establishment prior to the issuance of Permit to Operate and Certificate of Product Registration.

The result of on-site inspection and evaluation shall form part of the documentary requirements prior to the final review of the application and issuance of PTO and certificate of product registration.

SECTION 13 Approval/Denial of Application

Upon evaluation of the application, the SRED through its Division Chief shall recommend the approval/denial of the registration to the BAFE Director.

In case of denial of application, the BAFE shall notify the applicant in writing stating the grounds of denial.

The decision of the Director approving or denying the application shall be final.

SECTION 14 Surveillance Monitoring

After the grant of PTO and CPR, the establishment shall be subjected to monitoring any time of the year to ensure their continued compliance with the conditions of the registration to be conducted by BAFE, with or without prior notice.

ARTICLE V PERMIT TO OPERATE AND CERTIFICATE OF PRODUCT REGISTRATION

SECTION 15 Issuance of Permit to Operate and Certificate of Product Registration

Upon evaluation, verification, inspection and approval of the application and payment of the corresponding fee, a **Permit to Operate (PTO)** and **Certificate of Product Registration (CPR)** shall be issued by the BAFE Director. The PTO shall be placed conspicuously in the place of business readily visible to the public.

The PTO shall include the following information:

- a. Name and location of establishment;
- b. Classification of establishment;
- c. BAFE Registration number of the establishment;
- d. Validity of the PTO;
- e. Signature of the BAFE Director

The Certificate of Product Registration shall include the following information:

- a. The name and address/es of the establishment;
- b. The establishment registration number;
- c. The list of products registered;
- d. The date of issuance and expiration of registration; and
- e. Signature of the BAFE Director

In case the PTO/CPR is lost or destroyed, the applicant may request for a certified true copy to BAFE upon payment of the prescribed fee.

If and when at any time of the year the business operations of the establishment ceases, the registration fee paid shall not be refunded.

In considering the application for renewal, the BAFE shall ascertain the continued compliance of the establishment with the rules and regulations stipulated in this Circular.

SECTION 16 Validity Period of PTO and CPR

The following criteria sets the validity period of PTO and CPR:

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For MFADDIE engaged in the business for greater than or equal to five (5) years	3 years
For MFADDIE engaged in the business for less than five (5) years	1 year

SECTION 17 Amendments to Registration

In case of any change in the circumstances described in the application such as change of name of the establishment, change of location/address, change of ownership, etc., proper notification through writing shall be sent to the BAFE Director who shall require a new application to be filed for the registration of the establishment. The original copy of the PTO and CPR previously issued under the name of the former establishment shall be surrendered to the BAFE.

SECTION 18 Closure of Establishment and Cancellation of PTO

The PTO holder shall notify BAFE on the closure of establishment and cancellation of PTO through a Notice of Cease of Operation. No person or entity shall engage in any or all lines of activity stated in this Circular with cancelled PTO.

SECTION 19. Suspension, Revocation, Withdrawal or Cancellation

Permit to Operate (PTO) and Certificate of Product Registration (CPR) issued under this Guidelines may be suspended, revoked, withdrawn or cancelled due to any of the following grounds:

- a. The holder made false statements in connection with the application of the PTO and/or CPR; and
- b. The holder violates any of the provisions of this Guidelines.

A Notice of Violation shall be sent to the holder stating the grounds for the contemplated action. An appeal on the notice shall only be accepted within ten (10) working days upon the receipt of the notice. The appeal shall be subjected to the evaluation of BAFE.

In case of suspension, a motion for reconsideration in lifting the suspension shall be submitted to BAFE. The BAFE shall send a Lifting Notice to the holder once the motion for reconsideration is approved. On the other hand, a notice on revocation, withdrawal or cancellation of the PTO/CPR shall be sent to the holder that does not comply with the violated acts within the period as deemed appropriate by BAFE.

The holder who have been suspended for three times on any of the grounds stated in Section 23 shall result to an automatic revocation, withdrawal or cancellation of the PTO/CPR.

ARTICLE VI COMPLIANCE OF AGRICULTURAL AND FISHERIES MACHINERY TO STANDARDS

SECTION 20 Compliance of Registered Products to Standards

All applicants shall provide a copy of Compliance Certificate (CC) for each of the product to be registered to BAFE.

350 351 352 Pending the issuance of Compliance Certificate for agricultural and fisheries machinery as implemented under of the Department Circular No ____ Series of 2018, submission of said certification for product registration is waved.

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SECTION 21 Registry of MFADDIE and their Products

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The BAFE shall keep national registry of manufacturers, fabricators, assemblers, and importers and complete list of all agricultural and fisheries machinery products registered. Likewise, the regional registry shall be kept by the respective DA RFO RAED-SRES. The registry shall be for purpose of information generation and monitoring only.

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SECTION 22 Fees and Charges

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Collection of all fees and charges shall be paid at the BAFE cashier. Fees and charges may be subjected to changes, as deemed necessary. The fees and charges collected are non-refundable and subject to the usual government accounting and auditing rules and regulations. The following fees and charges shall be collected:

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Application Fee Issuance Fee (New) Issuance Fee (Renewal) **Change of Circumstance** Certified True Copy of PTO / CPR

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A separate guidelines relative to the issuance of PTO and CPR detailing the schedule of fees and charges will be issued by BAFE.

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ARTICLE VII FINAL PROVISIONS

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SECTION 23. **Prohibited Acts**

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The BAFE shall impose penalties after due notice and hearing to any of the following justifiable grounds:

- Commission of fraud and misrepresentation in the filing of the application and its operations;
 - Failure to comply with the standard requirements herein provided in this Circular and other laws;
 - Giving permission of the use of PTO to non-holder of the permit;
 - Manufacture, fabricate, distribute, sale, offer for sale of any agricultural and fisheries machinery without valid, withdrawn, suspended or cancelled PTO and CPR;
 - e. Refusal to give access to/copying of required documents to the BAFE during the on-site inspection and validation of the establishment's premises;
 - f. Continuous manufacturing, fabrication, assembly, distribution, dealing, importing and exporting of agricultural and fisheries machinery but fails to file an application for renewal;
 - Non-display of PTO in a conspicuous place in the establishment;
 - Commit any misconduct in selling agricultural and fisheries machinery.

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SECTION 24. Penalties and Sanctions

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24.1 **Penalties**

400 401 402 Any person who shall violate any provision of this Guidelines shall, upon conviction be subject to a fine of not less than One thousand pesos (Php1,000.00) but not more than Ten thousand pesos (Php10,000.00) or imprisonment of not less than two (2) months but not more than one (1) year, or both, upon the discretion of the court and/or other applicable penalties imposed under the AFMech Law.

403 404 In case of cancelled PTO and blacklisting, the applicant may re-apply after two (2) years and upon compliance to all the requirements stated in this Circular.

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24.2 Sanctions

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408 This provision shall take effect upon the enactment of this Guidelines. The BAFE Director or his/her duly 409 authorized representative has the power to take the following actions: 410 411 Issuance of a cease and desist order; 412 Cancellation, revocation or withdrawal of PTO/CPR or suspension of the validity; 413 414 415 **SECTION 25** Separability Clause 416 417 Should any provision of this Department Circular or any thereof be declared invalid, the other provisions, 418 so far as they are separable, shall remain in force and effect. 419 420 **SECTION 26** Repealing Clause 421 422 All existing Circulars, rules and regulations, or parts thereof, in conflict with, or inconsistent with any 423 provisions of this Regulation are hereby repealed or modified accordingly. 424 425 **SECTION 27 Effectivity** 426 427 This Circular shall take effect upon approval of the DA Secretary and fifteen (15) days upon its publication 428 in a newspaper of general circulation.
