



**Phytosanitary requirements for the importation of broccoli seed
(*Brassica oleraceae* var. *italica* Plenck), with origin and provenance from Australia.**

PHYTOSANITARY MEASURES TO APPLY

1. Phytosanitary Certificate issued by the National Plant Protection Organization (NPPO) of Australia, which must indicate in the additional declaration section, that the botanical seed of broccoli (*Brassica oleraceae* var. *italica* Plenck), was found free of *Alternaria brassicicola*, *Mycosphaerella brassicicola*, *Leptosphaeria biglobosa* and *Pseudocercospora capsellae*.
2. Origin application of the sequence of the following phytosanitary treatments, the specifications of the same must be indicated in the corresponding section of the Phytosanitary Certificate that accompanies the shipment, which must state the active ingredient and dose.
 - Immersion in hot water at 50 ° C for 30 minutes.
 - Followed by the application of a broad spectrum fungicide authorized in the country of origin for the prevention and/or control of *Alternaria brassicicola*, *Mycosphaerella brassicicola*, *Leptosphaeria biglobosa* and *Pseudocercospora capsellae*.
3. Broccoli seed must be packed for export to Mexico in new, clean and hermetically sealed containers, identified with traceability data [Name of the product, content (in net weight or number of seeds), country of origin and name of the exporting company].
4. Broccoli seed shipment must be free of soil, weed seeds or any other plant material other than the product to be imported.
5. Phytosanitary inspection at the point of entry into Mexico and sampling by official Senasica personnel. During the first year of importation of the product, the samples must be sent to the official laboratories of the National Center for Phytosanitary Reference, for the phytosanitary diagnosis of the fungi referred to in the additional declaration of the Phytosanitary Certificate. The DGSV will evaluate whether it delegates phytosanitary diagnoses to approved laboratories, at the end of the aforementioned period.
6. If during the inspection and diagnosis process, the presence of pests of quarantine interest for Mexico is detected, the entire batch or shipment must be rejected or destroyed.
