

Proposal for QR Code Labeling Requirement of Commodity Inspection Mark for Electric Instantaneous Water Heaters and Children’s Rain Coats

By the Bureau of Standards, Metrology and Inspection (BSMI), Ministry of Economic Affairs

Introduction:

Further to the amendment to the "Regulation Governing the Use of Commodity Inspection Mark," introducing QR code as an additional labeling requirement and notified by G/TBT/N/TPKM/468/Add.1, the Bureau of Standards, Metrology and Inspection (BSMI) is proposing to require that "electric instantaneous water heaters" and "children’s rain coats" be subject to QR code labeling to provide consumers with quick access to the compliance information of the products.

Proposed date of implementation: 6 months after promulgation.
