# The Cosmetic Products (Restriction of Chemical Substances) Regulations 2023

Made - - - - \*\*\*

Laid before Parliament \*\*\*

Coming into force in accordance with regulation 1

The Secretary of State makes these Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by Article 31(1)(b) of Regulation (EC) No 1223/2009 of the European Parliament and of the Council on cosmetic products (a).

#### Citation, commencement and extent

- **1.**—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Cosmetic Products (Restriction of Chemical Substances) Regulations 2023.
  - (2) These Regulations, except for regulation 2(2) come into force on 28th July 2023.
  - (3) Regulation 2(2) comes into force on 6th July 2024.
  - (4) These Regulations extend to England and Wales and Scotland.

#### Amendment to Regulation (EC) No 1223/2009

- **2.**—(1) Regulation (EC) No 1223/2009 of the European Parliament and of the Council on cosmetic products is amended as follows.
- (2) In the table in Annex 3 (list of substances which cosmetic products must not contain except subject to the restrictions laid down), insert the entries set out in Part 1 of the Schedule to these regulations.
- (3) At the end of the table in Annex 6 (list of UV filters allowed in cosmetic products), insert the entries set out in Part 2 of the Schedule to these regulations.

#### **Transitional Provisions**

**3.**—Notwithstanding the amendments in regulation 2(2), cosmetic products that are placed on the market prior to 6<sup>th</sup> July 2024 can be made available on the market until 6th July 2026.

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations amend Regulation (EC) No 1223/2009 of the European Parliament and of the Council on cosmetic products to restrict the use of certain chemical substances in cosmetic products.

Regulation 2 amends the technical annexes to the retained EU legislation, Regulation (EC) No 1223/2009 ("the Cosmetics Regulation") to restrict the use of Methyl-N-methylanthranilate, HAA299 and HAA299 (nano) in cosmetic products following advice from the Scientific Advisory Group on Chemical Safety.

Regulation 3 provides for transitional arrangements allowing cosmetics products containing Methyl-N-methylanthranilate to made available on the market after the coming into force of the Regulations if they were placed on the market prior to the coming into force of Regulation 2(2).

A full impact assessment has not been produced for this instrument as no, or no significant, impact on the private, voluntary or business sectors is foreseen. An Explanatory Memorandum has been published alongside these Regulations and is available at www.legislation.gov.uk.
