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Foreword

Development of the East African Standards has been necessitated by the need for harmonizing requirements governing quality of products and services in the East African Community. It is envisaged that through harmonized standardization, trade barriers that are encountered when goods and services are exchanged within the Community will be removed.

The Community has established an East African Standards Committee (EASC) mandated to develop and issue East African Standards (EAS). The Committee is composed of representatives of the National Standards Bodies in Partner States, together with the representatives from the public and private sector organizations in the community.

East African Standards are developed through Technical Committees that are representative of key stakeholders including government, academia, consumer groups, private sector and other interested parties. Draft East African Standards are circulated to stakeholders through the National Standards Bodies in the Partner States. The comments received are discussed and incorporated before finalization of standards, in accordance with the Principles and procedures for development of East African Standards.

East African Standards are subject to review, to keep pace with technological advances. Users of the East African Standards are therefore expected to ensure that they always have the latest versions of the standards they are implementing.

1 Scope

This Draft East African Standard specifies requirements, sampling and test methods for ammonium sulphate fertilizer.

4 Requirements

4.1 General requirements

- 4.1.1 Ammonium sulphate fertilizer shall be in the form of a free-flowing granules or crystals, free from foreign matter and impurities. The colour of the fertilizer shall be uniform.
- 4.1.2 When tested using ISO 8397, At least 90 % by weight of the material shall be of particles in the size range of 1 mm to 4 mm for crystals and 2 mm to 4 mm for granules.

4.2 Specific requirements

Ammonium sulphate fertilizer shall comply with the specific requirements given in Table 1 when tested in accordance with the test methods prescribed therein.

5 Contaminants

Heavy metal contaminants in ammonium sulphate fertilizer shall conform to the limits given in Table 2 when tested in accordance with the test methods prescribed therein.

7 Packaging

Ammonium sulphate fertilizer shall be packaged in materials that are clean and non-defective that protects the product from physical, chemical and moisture contamination and withstand multiple stages of handling (transportation and storage).

8 Labelling

Each package shall be legibly and indelibly labeled in accordance with ISO 7409 in English and/or any other official language in the destination country with the following information:

- a) name of the fertilizer; "Ammonium Sulphate Fertilizer"
- b) brand name if any;
- c) name and address of the manufacturer /importer;
- d) nutrient contents;
- e) net content by mass in metric units;
- f) handling instructions including the words "Use No Hooks";
- g) production date and expiry date;
- h) country of origin;
- i) batch number; and
- j) storage conditions.

9 Sampling

Sampling and sample preparation of ammonium sulphate fertilizers shall be carried out as prescribed in ISO 14820-1 and ISO 14820-2 respectively.
