ESTABLISHES THE PHYTOSANITARY REQUIREMENTS FOR THE IMPORTATION OF *HYDRANGEA* SPP. PROPAGATIVE MATERIAL FROM ANY ORIGIN

THE SECRETARY OF AGRICULTURAL PROTECTION, OF THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND LIVESTOCK, in the use of the attributions conferred on it by arts. 22 and 49 of Annex I of Decree No. 11.332, of January 1, 2023, in view of the provisions of Decree No. 24,114, of April 12, 1934, in Decree No. 1,355, of December 30, 1994, in Decree No. 5,759, of April 17, 2006, in MAPA Ordinance No. 65, of March 30, 2021, in Normative Instruction No. 25, of April 7, 2020, and what is contained in Process No. 21000.000816/2024-99, resolves:

Art. 1° The phytosanitary requirements for the importation of propagative material (Category 4) of *Hydrangea* spp. from any origin are established.

Art. 2° *Hydrangea* spp. seedlings and cuttings must be accompanied by a Phytosanitary Certificate, issued by the National Plant Protection Organization - NPPO of the country of origin, with the following Additional Declarations:

I - "The consignment was inspected and found free from *Ceroplastes japonicus*, *Ceroplastes* rubens, Colosius confusus, Compsus viridivittatus, Eotetranychus lewisi, Eotetranychus sexmaculatus, Epiphyas postvittana, Frankliniella intonsa, Lopholeucaspis japonica, Macrodactylus subspinosus, Neomyzus circumflexus, Nysius nubilus, Otiorhynchus singularis, Otiorhynchus sulcatus, Parthenolecanium corni, Pulvinaria hydrangeae, Rastrococcus invadens, Scirtothrips dorsalis, Tetranychus kanzawai, Tetranychus merganser, Thrips flavus and Thrips setosus."; and,

II - "The consignment is free from *Ditylenchus dipsaci*, *Eggplant mottled dwarf virus*, *Impatiens necrotic spot virus*, *Phomopsis velata*, *Phytophthora ramorum*, *Tobacco rattle virus*, *Tobacco ringspot virus*, *Tomato ringspot virus* and *Xanthomonas hydrangeae*, according to the result of the official laboratory analysis No ()".

Art. 3° *Hydrangea* spp. *in vitro* seedlings must be accompanied by a Phytosanitary Certificate, issued by the National Plant Protection Organization - NPPO of the country of origin, with the following Additional Declaration:

I - "The consignment is free from *Eggplant mottled dwarf virus*, *Impatiens necrotic spot virus*, *Tobacco rattle virus*, *Tobacco ringspot virus* and *Tomato ringspot virus*, according to the result of the official laboratory analysis No ()".

Art. 4° According to the phytosanitary status in its territory, the country of origin may, alternatively, declare for the regulated pests above:

I - "(Name of pest/s) is an absent quarantine pest for (country of origin)."; or

II - "(Name of pest/s) is not present (country of origin)."

Art. 5° The country of origin must previously communicate, for approval by the NPPO of Brasil, the Additional Declaration that will be used in the issuance of the Phytosanitary Certificate.

§ 1° If there is no prior communication and approval provided for in the caput of this article, the country of origin must comply with the provisions of art. 2° and 3°, being unable to use the alternative declarations provided for in art. 4°.

§ 2° The country of origin must inform the change in the phytosanitary status of the indicated pests, when there is a change in the status in its territory.

Art. 6° The consignments are subject to inspection at the point of entry (Phytosanitary Inspection - PI), as well as the collection of samples for phytosanitary analysis in official laboratories or laboratories accredited by the Ministry of Agriculture and Livestock - MAPA.

§ 1. The costs of sending the samples and the phytosanitary analysis will be borne by the interested party.
§ 2. At the inspection's discretion, the interested party may remain as the depositary of the remainder of the consignment until the inspection process is completed.

Art. 7° In the event of interception of a quarantine pest or a pest that presents quarantine potential for Brazil, the consignment will be destroyed or rejected and the NPPO in the country of origin will be notified, and the NPPO in Brazil may suspend imports of *Hydrangea* spp. propagative material from this country until the review of the Pest Risk Analysis.

Art. 8° The consignment will not be internalized when it fails to comply with the requirements established in this Ordinance.

Art. 9° This Ordinance enters into force on the date of xx of xxxx, 2024.

§ 1° For seedlings of *Hydrangea macrophylla* from The Netherlands, a period of 180 (one hundred and eighty) days is granted for the National Phytosanitary Protection Organization - NPPO of the country of origin adapt their procedure to apply the requirements set out in this Ordinance.

§ 2° For cuttings of *Hydrangea macrophylla* from Italy, a period of 180 (one hundred and eighty) days is granted for the National Phytosanitary Protection Organization - NPPO of the country of origin adapt their procedure to apply the requirements set out in this Ordinance.

§ 3° During the period provided for in § 1 and § 2, the requirements in force at the time of entry into force of this Ordinance apply.
